Happy Summer to all of you!

As we approach the halfway point of the calendar year, we are finishing up another very successful Annual Matching Donor Campaign. Our very generous, long-time member of the congregation, Susan Weaver donated \$15000 and challenged us to meet or exceed that donation. Once again, we were not only able to meet the challenge, but slay it! Thank you to everyone of you for your support! Thanks also to the organizations who consistently add to the success of these campaigns ... The UCW, The Tuesday Morning Craft Group, Fyd-L-Styx, and The St. James Players. When we work together, we are strong! We have had two stewardship campaigns this year and have raised more than \$35000 over and above our envelope and PAR donations. These campaigns are crucial to the life of the church. Thank you, St. James for your contributions to all that we do!

The gift card fundraiser continues to be a success with over \$2300 earned so far this year. It is an easy way for you to raise money for the church with 3-4% of the value of the card being earned by the church. That is free money! Thank you to Jim Lowes for your ongoing work with this!

These fundraising efforts will go a long way in helping the church to meet its financial obligations during the summer, when receipts are historically less than the rest of the year, but expenses continue. Thank you to every one of you who give what you can on a regular basis.

A mild winter and spring have resulted in a decrease in some of our operating costs so far this year. While we are still sitting with a deficit of about \$20,000, it is substantially lower than at the same time last year. Hopefully we can continue to keep our costs down and increase our revenues as the year progresses.
